

**POSTAL SERVICES ACT 2000**  
**SECTIONS 11 AND 12**  
**NOTICE**  
**OF PROPOSAL TO GRANT A LICENCE TO**  
**DEUTSCHE POST GLOBAL MAIL (UK) LIMITED**

Whereas –

- (1) Deutsche Post Global Mail (UK) Limited a company incorporated under the Companies Act 1985 with registration number 2104109 having its registered office at 2 Lambs Passage, London EC1Y 8BB (“the Applicant”) on 5 June 2002 applied for a licence under section 11 of the Postal Services Act 2000 (“the Act”) and paid the appropriate application fee.
- (2) The application is for the conveyance of letters which originate from a single user at one address and which are mailings of 4,000 or more items and for consolidation of mailings of less than 4,000 items for conveyance to Consignia and subsequent conveyance by Consignia. The total number of letters conveyed pursuant to this licence shall be not greater than 40,000,000 in any rolling 12 month period.
- (3) The Postal Services Commission (“the Commission”) is minded subject to consultation to grant a licence to the Applicant.

**The Commission therefore gives notice as follows –**

1. The Commission proposes, subject to consideration of representations made in accordance with this notice and not withdrawn, to grant a licence under section 11 of the Act to the Applicant.
2. The provisions of the licence that the Commission proposes to grant to the Applicant are set out in the Annex to this Notice.
3. The reasons for the proposal of the Commission to grant a licence to the Applicant are that –
  - (a) the Commission is of the view that the grant of the licence on the terms proposed will have no appreciable adverse effect on the provision of a universal postal service in the United Kingdom and that if any such effect were to arise it would be adequately addressed by the safeguards described below,

- (b) the Commission is of the view that the grant of the licence will further the interests of users of postal services by promoting competition between postal operators, and
- (c) the grant of a licence on the terms proposed is consistent with -
  - (i) the Commission's interim policy on the grant of licences set out in its Letter to Postcomm consultees headed Interim Approach to Licensing and dated 30 April 2001, and
  - (ii) the Commission's proposals for promoting effective competition in UK postal services which were published in May 2002 and which will provide for licences for large scale mailings and consolidation.

4. Safeguards for the universal service that are provided in the proposed form of licence are -

- (a) the short duration of the licence of one year from the date of grant, and
- (b) the restrictions on the activities that may be conducted pursuant to this licence set out in Condition 2 of the annexed draft.

5. Representations regarding the proposed licence may be made to the Commission within the period commencing on and including the date of this notice and ending on and including the thirtieth day after the date of this notice.
